



Harrisburg wins the Pennsylvania Passing League Central Division title at Susquehanna Township

Harrisburg knocked off the host school, Susquehanna Township, in the title game

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HARRISBURG, PA – Harrisburg won the Pennsylvania Passing League – Central Division title with a 21-0 win over Susquehanna Township in the title game of the 3rd Annual PPL-Central event hosted by Susquehanna Township. The Cougars went 6-0 in the event to win its first-ever PPL title, joining Manheim Township and Plymouth-Whitemarsh as previous winners of the PPL event at Susquehanna Township. Harrisburg outscored its opponents 163-59 during the event. Harrisburg's toughest game was a 36-30 triple-overtime win over Line Mountain in the second of its three pool play games.

Since 2012, the Pennsylvania Passing League has hosted 64 teams and as many as 1,280 student-athletes at events at Gateway High School and Susquehanna Township High School. PPL events are single-day seven-on-seven passing tournaments that feature high school football players from throughout the Keystone State. Each participating team is guaranteed to play four games with three games in pool play to determine the seeding for the single-elimination championship round.
