Army honors Vanguard's Burgess

Leo Burgess got his ring.

The Vanguard High senior was awarded the U.S. Army Iron Man of the Year Award on Thursday afternoon, which included a diamond-encrusted ring for the best two-way football player in north Florida.

Burgess beat out North Marion High sophomore Latroy Pittman for top honors with 2,545 votes, compared to 2,085 for Pittman, as more than 10,000 fans, coaches and media voted on the 2009 award.

"It's overwhelming, really," Burgess said of the honor. "I missed my junior year of football, but I came back and started taking a leadership role. I went over to defense because I figured I might as well play as much as I could my senior year."

Burgess, a member of the Class 3A all-state team, led Vanguard with 1,552 all-purpose yards and 13 touchdowns as the Knight's feature back on offense.

He also logged 29 tackles, an interception, a fumble recovery and a defensive touchdown from his strong safety spot on the other side of the ball.

The award, which is sponsored by the U.S. Army Jacksonville Recruiting Battalion, is designed to honor a player who demonstrates "physical and emotional strength, as well as strength of character."

Vanguard head coach Alex Castaneda believes Burgess embodies the description.

"He's a competitor," Castaneda said following the ceremony at VHS. "Even though he was our starting tailback, he came to me and asked if we could use him on defense. He just wanted to compete."

After being selected as Missouri's Army Iron Man of the Week during the third week of the season, Spartan sophomore Durren Neal is now a finalist for the 2009 Army Iron Man of the Year. Cast your vote by [clicking here](#) by midnight, November 22.

Through 11 games this season, Neal has reached the end zone 15 times, three of which came on returns. Offensively, the six-foot, 180-pounder hauled in 16 receptions for 411 yards and has rushed six times for 160 yards.

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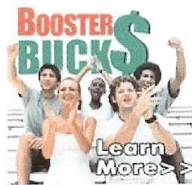

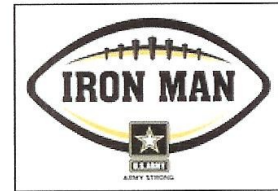

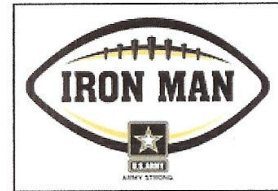

Eckert Earns Iron Man Title with Outstanding Performance

Students and community members combined to e-mail and vote online for Jake Eckert to win the Army Iron Man of the Year award for Kansas. To those who participated, Eckert says, "Thanks to everyone that voted. It was quite impressive how the whole community got behind me and supported me."

Throughout the 2009 Minneapolis High School football season, the Minneapolis Lions offensive attack was one of the most unstoppable forces around. They amassed more than 350 total points and had just less than 4000 yards of total offense.

One of the most pivotal parts of the attack was the man now known as Jake "Iron Man" Eckert, earned when Eckert won the prestigious award, presented to one high school player in the state each year.

Eckert was nominated for this award because of his stellar performance in week 6 when he unleashed a barrage of physicality upon the Buffalos of Republic County.

Eckert racked up a total of 405 rushing yards and 5 touchdowns, 105 return yards and another touchdown, and also 32 receiving yards. This totaled up to be 542 yards total with 6 total touchdowns.

His astonishing performance wasn't matched throughout the rest of the year; however, his productivity never waned as he ended the season with a more than solid 1490 yards rushing and 20 rushing touchdowns.

The future of Minneapolis' ground game is solidified for at least one more year with Eckert currently making his way through his junior year and preparing for his senior campaign. Great things are expected for Eckert and the rest of the Lions for the 2010 season.

Spradling nominated for Iron Man

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After a stunning performance last week, Louisburg High School running back Jason Spradling was nominated for The U.S. Army Iron Man of the Week, an award that honors the best two-way performance for football players in the state.

Spradling, who rushed for 233 yards and three touchdowns in the Wildcats' win over Gardner-Edgerton, came up with a huge end-zone interception Sept. 14 in the 37-20 victory.

Other candidates include J.D. Steffen, Shawnee Mission West; Ashton Stephens, Seaman; Chase Williams, Cheney; Shane Miller, De Soto; Kent Riemann, Flint Hills; and Drew Davis, Coffeyville.

As of Thursday morning, Spradling was in first place ahead of Steffen with 370 votes. Voting ended at 6 p.m. Thursday, but results were not available at press time.

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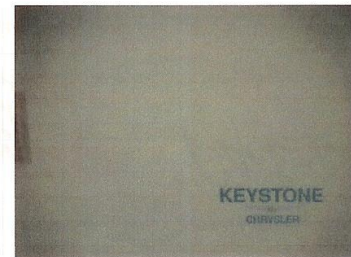

GCHS' Pelfrey wins Army Iron Man Award

Dillon Pelfrey, a sophomore running back, has been selected as the Army Iron Man of the Week. If he receives enough votes, he could be named Army Iron Man of the Year.

A season of firsts for the Grant County High School football team continued last week as sophomore running back Dillon Pelfrey was the recipient of the U.S. Army Nashville Recruiting Battalion's Army Iron Man of the Week Award presented by Jostens in the battalion's Kentucky recruiting territory. As a weekly winner, Pelfrey is eligible for the Army Iron Man of the Year Award in Kentucky.

Pelfrey amassed 665 total votes, while Demetri Travis, of Perry Central, recorded 521 votes. Greenwood's Cory Henon received 191 votes, and Ian Mittelberg, of Hancock County, received 182 votes.

According to a press release, the recipient of the award "must demonstrate physical and emotional strength, as well as strength of character. The Army Iron Man embodies the qualities of Army STRONG."

The award came after Pelfrey's performance against the Jeffersontown Chargers, as he helped lift the Braves to their first district win in six years and a 41-16 road victory.

Against the Chargers, Pelfrey rushed for 126 yards and three touchdowns on nine carries, made 12 tackles, deflected two passes and returned two kick-offs for 116 yards.

"Dillon is the first Grant County football player to win the award, and it is a huge honor for him. It is just something else for us to celebrate here at Grant County," head coach Mike Davis said.

Davis said that it was not just Pelfrey's classmates and GCHS faculty and staff members who voted for the sophomore, but rather "a lot of people."

"The entire community and county got behind him. I heard from several other coaches who said they were casting a vote for Dillon. It's nice to see people recognize what we have here at Grant County. I hope all of Grant County will get behind Dillon when it comes to voting for Player of the Year," Davis said.

Pelfrey took the award in stride, wanting to put the focus on his offensive line rather than on himself.

"I appreciate it a lot. Most of the school voted for me, which was nice. I wouldn't have been able to get all those yards in games without the great

Myrtle Beach QB cleared to play in opener

Myrtle Beach senior quarterback Andrew Ellis, who had been diagnosed with mononucleosis, was cleared Tuesday to play in the regular-season opener at Conway.

Doctors performed tests on Ellis' liver and spleen and found no reason to keep him out of Thursday's matchup at The Backyard, Myrtle Beach coach Scott Earley said.

Mononucleosis causes the spleen to enlarge, and, in rare cases, it can rupture.

It turns out that Ellis had been playing with the illness for several weeks.

"We just thought he was in a funk," Earley said. "It's nice to know why he was struggling."

Ellis has started 27 consecutive games and thrown for 4,600 yards and 42 touchdowns in the last two years.

Although he heads into Thursday's game as Myrtle Beach's starter, he will share snaps with freshman Everett Golson, who threw an 87-yard touchdown on his first play in last week's CNB Kickoff Classic.

Cream of the crop

Conway senior Evan Childs has been chosen as one of the top 100 softball recruits in the nation by adidas.

Childs, who has scholarship offers from Liberty, Charleston Southern, Furman and Georgia, will participate in a recruiting showcase this weekend in St. George, Utah, where she will have the opportunity to perform in front of college coaches from across the county.

"It will help me learn how to better perform in front of the coaches," said Childs, who hopes to earn a scholarship offer from South Carolina. "I think it will help me to play with more experienced girls and with girls that have more talent."

The event starts Friday, but Childs was not willing to leave before Thursday night's football game between Myrtle Beach and Conway. Her brother, Haddon Childs, is Conway's starting punter.

Evan Childs, an all-state performer in softball and an all-region performer in volleyball and basketball, would like to make a college decision by November's early signing period.
