THE STARTING 5

Pac-12 regular season champion Oregon is the #7 seed in the West Region and will open the NCAA Tournament against #10 seed VCU Saturday at 6:57 p.m. PT at Farmers Coliseum in Indianapolis, Ind. (TNT).

- 1 – This is Oregon's seventh NCAA Tournament appearance in the last eight tournaments, and overall it is the Ducks' 10th straight postseason appearance (The NCAA Tournament was not contested in 2020).
- 2 – The 2021 Pac-12 regular season championship is the eighth league title in program history, joining 1919, 1939, 1945, 2002, 2016, 2017 and 2020. It is the Ducks' fourth league title in the last six years.
- 3 – Oregon has now won 20 games for the 11th consecutive season. Gonzaga, Kansas and Belmont are currently the only other three Division I programs nationally with 11 straight 20-win seasons.
- 4 – Combined, Oregon's four scholarship seniors - **Chris Duarte**, **LJ Figueroa**, **Eugene Omoruyi** and **Amauri Hardy** - are averaging 49.9 points per game.
- 5 – **Chris Duarte** is one of five national finalists for the Jerry West Point Guard of the Year Award. *He is one of only two Division I players in the country averaging at least 16.7 points and 1.9 steals per game while shooting 50 percent from the field.*
- BENCH – 2020-21 marks **Dana Altman's** 24th consecutive winning season as a head coach. He is one of five head coaches in Division I with an active streak of 24 or more consecutive winning seasons. That list includes Altman and four Hall of Famers: Jim Boeheim, Mike Krzyzewski, Bill Self and Tom Izzo.

NOTES

THE FIRST NCAA CHAMPIONS

Oregon's 1939 basketball team earned a niche in sports history by winning the first NCAA championship basketball tournament ever held. With a first unit composed of four native Oregonians and one Washingtonian, coach Howard Hobson guided the "Tall Firs" to a 29-5 season record and Oregon's only NCAA basketball title. Oregon's title run began in the Western Playoffs at Treasure Island, Calif., by knocking off Texas, 56-41, and dropping Oklahoma, 55-37. On March 27, the Tall Firs faced Ohio State on the neutral Northwestern University court at Evanston, Ill., for the national title. John Dick scored 13 points and Laddie Gale and Bobby Anet contributed 10 apiece as the Ducks rolled to a 46-33 victory and the NCAA crown.

VERSUS THE WEST REGION OPPONENTS

Oregon and VCU have met just once. The two teams played in the 2014 Legends Classic at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. The Rams won that meeting 77-63. The winner of Saturday's game will play the winner between #2 Iowa and #15 Grand Canyon. The Ducks and Hawkeyes also last met in a New York City borough - Manhattan. Iowa defeated Oregon 77-69 in the 2018 2K Empire Classic at Madison Square Garden. The Hawkeyes lead the all-time series 6-1. Oregon has never played Grand Canyon.

LAST TIME IN INDIANA

Oregon last played in Indianapolis in a 2013 NCAA Tournament Midwest Regional Sweet 16 loss to eventual national champion Louisville (77-69). Farmers Coliseum is the home court of the IUPUI Jaguars. It is also the only arena in the state of Indiana that hosted a concert by the Beatles (1964) and is the former home of the Indiana Pacers.

NCAA THREE DOT DATA

This is just the fifth time that both the UO men and women will play in the NCAA Tournament (1995, 2000, 2017, 2019) ... This is Oregon's 17th NCAA Tournament appearance overall and the seventh under Dana Altman.

OREGON IN THE NCAA UNDER ALTMAN

In the previous six appearances under **Dana Altman**, Oregon:

- has won at least one game every tournament
- has advanced to the Sweet 16 four times (2013, 2016, 2017, 2019)
- has advanced to the Elite 8 twice (2016, 2017)
- has advanced to the Final Four once (2017)
- has lost to a lower-seeded team only one time (2016, falling as the No. 1 seed to No. 2 Oklahoma in the West Regional Final)
- was eliminated all six times by teams that advanced to the Final Four
- lost three times to the eventual national champion (2013 - Louisville, 2017 - North Carolina, 2019 - Virginia)

NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

Four Ducks have previous NCAA Tournament experience. **Will Richardson** came off the bench in all three games during Oregon's 2019 NCAA Sweet 16 run. He had seven points and five rebounds in the first round game against Wisconsin. Walk-ons **Luke Osborn** and **Will Johnson** both saw the floor during the 2019 Ducks' second round win against UC Irvine. **LJ Figueroa** scored 19 points with 10 rebounds for St. John's in a 2019 First Four loss to Arizona State.

LAST TIME AS A #7 SEED

Oregon was last a #7 seed in the 2014 NCAA Tournament. In the West Regional in Milwaukee, Wis. #7 Oregon defeated #10 BYU 87-68 in the opening round before falling to #2 Wisconsin 85-77 in the Round of 32.

11 STRAIGHT 20-WIN SEASONS

The Pac-12 Tournament quarterfinal win against Arizona State was Oregon's 20th win of the season, making the Ducks one of just four programs nationally with an active streak of 11 consecutive seasons with 20 wins. The four schools on that list are Oregon, Belmont, Gonzaga and Kansas (Wichita State (16-5) could also still reach its 11th straight 20-win season in 2020-21).

LEADERS OF THE PAC

Oregon leads the Pac-12 in field goal percentage (.472), three-point field goal percentage (.379), steals (7.5 per game) and three-pointers per game (8.4).

PROTECT THE ROCK

Oregon has committed 12 turnovers or less in 11 of its last 12 games. Four times in that span, the Ducks had less than 10 turnovers. In conference play Oregon averaged just 10.7 turnovers per game.

OREGON SETS SCHOOL MARK WITH 11TH STRAIGHT WINNING SEASON

Oregon has locked up its 11th consecutive winning season, a program first. The previous best was 10 winning seasons in a row over the decade between 1923-32, under coaches **William Reinhart** and **George Bohler**. Oregon now has a program-record 279 wins over the last 11 seasons.

FOUR 1,000 POINT SCORERS ON THE ROSTER

Feb. 13 at Arizona, **Eugene Omoruyi** became the fourth current Duck to have scored 1,000 points in college. Two other teammates reached that milestone this year - **Eric Williams Jr.** Dec. 31 against California and **LJ Figueroa** Dec. 19 versus Portland. **Amauri Hardy** came into the year with 1,000 points scored while playing for UNLV. Oregon and Ole Miss are the only two programs in the country with four active 1,000-point scorers.

ALTMAN RECORDS 24TH CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASON

Dana Altman now has 24 consecutive winning seasons as a head coach. He is currently one of five active head coaches in NCAA Division I who have posted a winning record for 24 consecutive seasons (the other four are in the Hall of Fame). For Altman, that streak runs from the 1997-98 season through 2020-21, and covers his final 13 seasons at Creighton and his first 11 in Eugene.

DUARTE NAMED A JERRY WEST AWARD FINALIST

Senior guard **Chris Duarte** was named one of five finalists for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. He is the first Jerry West Award finalist in program history. Duarte, from Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic, is one of only two Division I players in the nation averaging 16.7 points and 1.9 steals per game while shooting 50 percent from the field. Elijah Ford of Wagner is the other. Duarte is ranked among the Pac-12's top 10 in six different statistical categories. He is eighth in scoring (16.7 points per game), second in steals (1.9 per game), second in three-pointers per game (2.4), fourth in three-point field goal percentage (.430) and 10th in field goal percentage (.524). The other Jerry West Award finalists are Joel Ayayi of Gonzaga, Quentin Grimes of Houston, MaCio Teague of Baylor and Joe Wieskamp of Iowa.

DUARTE ALL-AMERICA COUNT GOES TO FOUR AND COUNTING

Chris Duarte picked up two more All-America honors the week of the NCAA Tournament, bringing his season total to four. He was named a third-team All-American by both the Associated Press and the U.S. Basketball Writers Association. Previously, he was selected as a third-team All-American by College Hoops Today/Jon Rothstein and Basketball Times.

DUARTE, OMORUYI EARN ALL-PAC-12 HONORS; DUARTE NAMED AP PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Two seniors who helped Oregon win its fourth Pac-12 regular season title in the last six years, **Chris Duarte** and **Eugene Omoruyi**, were named to the All-Pac-12 first team in a vote by the coaches, while Duarte was named the Pac-12 Player of the Year by the Associated Press. Duarte was also named to the league's all-defensive team. Duarte and Omoruyi gave the Ducks two players on the first team for just the second time since 2003. **Dillon Brooks** and **Elgin Cook** were both first team selections in 2016. Duarte is the seventh Duck in the last seven years to be named to the all-defensive team, but is the first guard from Oregon to make the all-defensive team.

OH CANADA

Eugene Omoruyi is the 11th Canadian to play for the Ducks during the **Dana Altman** era. Some of the more notable Canadian Ducks are **Dillon Brooks** (Memphis Grizzlies), **Chris Boucher** (Toronto Raptors) and **Dylan Ennis**, who is playing overseas and led the 2017 Final Four team in minutes played.

DEFENDING CHAMPIONS

Oregon is currently the defending back-to-back Pac-12 champion in both men's basketball (2019-20 and 2020-21) and football (2019 and 2020).

NOTES

SECOND HALF SURGE

Under coach **Dana Altman**, Oregon has the best second half record in the Pac-12. Since the 2010-11 season, Oregon is 71-28 (.717) during the second half of Pac-12 play. That breaks down to 4-5 in 2011, 7-2 in 2012, 5-4 in 2013, 7-2 in 2014, 8-1 in 2015, 7-2 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017, 5-4 in 2018, 6-3 in 2019, 6-3 in 2020 and 8-1 in 2021.

DUARTE TIES UO RECORD WITH FOURTH CAREER POTW AWARD

For the fourth time in his career, senior guard Chris Duarte was named Pac-12 Player of the Week for the final week of the regular season. Duarte averaged 18.3 points per game on 57 percent shooting (17-of-30), including 58 percent behind the arc (7-of-12), along with 4.7 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game to help Oregon go 3-0 and clinch its second consecutive Pac-12 regular-season title. Duarte opened week with 22 points and seven rebounds in a win over Arizona, then added 23 points in the win over UCLA. He capped the week with 10 points and six assists in the finale at Oregon State as the Ducks clinched their fourth Pac-12 regular-season title in the last six years. This was the second time this season and the fourth time in his career that Duarte has been named Pac-12 Player of the Week. Duarte's four career POTW awards tie him with a pair of NBA players for the most ever won by a Duck. Dillon Brooks was a four-time honoree during his Oregon career (2015-17) as was Blair Rasmussen in the 1980s (1982-85). Brooks is currently in his fourth season with Memphis, while Rasmussen had an eight-year NBA career with Denver and Atlanta.

DUARTE REPUBLIC

Chris Duarte had his highlight moment Feb. 13 at Arizona, hitting the game-winning three-pointer with :17 remaining. Between Dec. 19 and Jan. 9, Duarte had a five-game stretch where he averaged 23.0 points, 4.2 rebounds, 3.2 steals and 1.2 blocks per game while hitting 57.7 percent from the field (41-of-71) and 50 percent from three-point range (19-of-38).

OMORUYI DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORING

Senior forward **Eugene Omoruyi** is the only Duck to start all 26 games this season and has scored in double figures in 24 of those 26 contests. In the Ducks' regular-season finale on March 7, Omoruyi scored 18 points in the second half at Oregon State. March 1, he scored 21 points against Arizona. Feb. 25 at Stanford, Omoruyi checked in with his third double-double of the season, 12 points and 10 rebounds. He had 21 points with seven rebounds Feb. 4 against Washington State; 25 points and three steals Feb. 6 versus Washington; his second double-double of the season with 18 points and 10 rebounds Feb. 11 at Arizona State; 18 points Feb. 13 at Arizona; 13 points and a career-high five steals Feb. 18 against Colorado. Omoruyi was nearly unstoppable in the paint Dec. 31 versus California, making nine-of-10 field goal attempts in the lane, finishing with 26 points and a career-high five steals. He had 15 points and a season-high five assists Jan. 2 against Stanford and 18 points Jan. 7 at Colorado. He has been Oregon's leading scorer 10 times.

STAT FILLER FIGUEROA

The Ducks are 20-4 in games in which senior transfer **LJ Figueroa** plays. His three-point shooting has come around recently. In Pac-12 games, he made 40.7 percent (33-of-81) from distance. Figueroa scored a season-high 21 points in Oregon's Pac-12 Tournament win against Arizona State. He had a career game Feb. 27 at California. He grabbed a career-high 14 rebounds to go with 20 points and a season-high five steals. He scored 16 points Feb. 11 at Arizona State. Figueroa had his third double-double of the season Feb. 4 against Washington State (12 points, 11 rebounds). It was the last of six straight games scoring in double figures. That streak that dated back to Dec. 19 against Portland (15 points). Jan. 2 against Stanford, it was his rebound dunk to tie the game at 41-41 with 12:43 to go that seemed to spark the Ducks; Oregon outscored Stanford 32-15 the rest of the way. Ranking 10th in the Pac-12 in rebounds (6.1 per game), Figueroa has led Oregon in rebounding nine times this season, steals six times and blocks three times. Figueroa missed Oregon's season-opening Dec. 2 loss to Missouri before the NCAA approved his transfer waiver on Dec. 3. As a junior in 2019-20, Figueroa led St. John's in scoring at 14.5 points per game. The Lawrence, Mass., native paced the Big East in steals at 1.9 per game last season.

RICHARDSON SETS CAREER HIGH IN FINAL WEEK

Will Richardson closed out the 2020-21 regular season in style. In the final week, Richardson scored 12 points March 1 against Arizona, 15 points March 3 versus UCLA and a career-high 22 points March 7 at Oregon State. Richardson saw his first action of the season Feb. 4 against Washington State and scored in double figures the first three games of his return. He had 10 points against the Cougars, 19 points against Washington (Feb. 6) and 15 Feb. 11 at Arizona State. For the second-straight year, he made the game-winning assist at Arizona. Last year he drove and drew the defense and found **Shakur Juiston** for a wide-open layin. This year, he once again drove and drew the defense and kicked the ball to an open **Chris Duarte** for the game-winning three-pointer. Richardson missed the first 12 games of the year after suffering a thumb injury just prior to Oregon's season opener on Dec. 2. He led the Pac-12 in three-point field goal shooting last season at 46.9 percent (38-of-81). The junior from Hinesville, Ga., was at his best late in the season when he scored in double figures in nine of the last 11 games of 2019-20. He averaged 14.2 points per game in that span and hit 54.5 percent from three-point range (18-of-33).

REBOUNDER REBOUNDS

Eric Williams Jr., missed nearly a month of the season between Jan. 23 and Feb. 20 due to both COVID-19 related issues as well as being bothered by a sore knee. He's starting to round back into early season form. Feb. 22 at USC, Williams Jr. scored 14 points - his best effort since a season-high 19 at Utah on Jan. 9 - and just missed a double-double with nine rebounds. Williams Jr. has grabbed at least six rebounds in 16-of-22 games this season and ranks ninth in the Pac-12 at 6.1 rebounds per game.

KEPNANG ROLE GROWS

Franck Kepnang, the 6-11 freshman who reclassified from the 2021 class and joined the team at the quarter break, has led the team in blocks eight times in his first 15 games. Kepnang made his Oregon debut Jan. 9 at Utah. He then scored five points in six minutes Jan. 23 against Oregon State. His best effort to date came Feb. 6 against Washington when he had eight points and two blocks. He was impressive at Arizona with seven points and three rebounds. Kepnang added a season-best three blocks Feb. 18 against Colorado. He collected a season-best five rebounds Feb. 20 versus Utah.

NOTES

TERRY HITS FROM DEEP

Freshman **Jalen Terry** made his first start Jan. 23 against Oregon State and scored 13 points on 5-of-7 shooting (3-of-4 from three-point range). Two games later, he had 15 points on 5-of-7 shooting from deep Feb. 6 against Washington.

ALTMAN NOW 23RD IN NCAA DIVISION I COACHING WINS

Dana Altman now ranks 23rd all-time in NCAA Division I coaching wins with 689. Among active coaches, Altman ranks ninth. Ahead of him on that list are Mike Krzyzewski (Duke), Jim Boeheim (Syracuse), Roy Williams (North Carolina), Bob Huggins (West Virginia), Cliff Ellis (Coastal Carolina), John Calipari (Kentucky), Rick Barnes (Tennessee) and Bill Self (Kansas). Krzyzewski, Boeheim, Williams, Calipari and Self are all members of the Basketball Hall of Fame.

DUCKS SIGN ALTMAN THROUGH 2025-26

In March of 2019, University of Oregon Director of Athletics Rob Mullens announced a contract extension with head coach **Dana Altman** that will keep him in Eugene through the 2025-26 season.

ALTMAN NOW WINS LEADER AT TWO DIVISION I SCHOOLS

Dana Altman is now the winningest coach at two Division I institutions - Oregon (279) and Creighton (327 wins in 16 seasons). He's one of just eight coaches who is the current career wins leader at two different NCAA Division I institutions. The others include Jim Calhoun (Connecticut, Northeastern), Cliff Ellis (Clemson, Coastal Carolina), Lou Henson (Illinois, New Mexico State), Ron Hunter (Georgia State, IUPUI), Danny Kaspar (Stephen F. Austin, Texas State), Gregg Marshall (Wichita State, Winthrop) and Willis Wilson (Rice, Texas A&M Corpus Christi).

CLOSING TIME: DUARTE NAMED PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chris Duarte was named Pac-12 Player of the Week for Dec. 28-Jan. 3. The senior from Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic, averaged 21.0 points per game on 50 percent shooting (15-of-30), including 47 percent from three-point range (9-of-19) in the Ducks' weekend sweep of California and Stanford. He also averaged 4.5 rebounds and 2.5 steals per game. Duarte was at his best in the closing minutes of each game. He scored 14 of his 19 points in the final 5:18 to help the Ducks turn a three-point lead into a 13-point victory over the Golden Bears on Dec. 31. Jan. 2 versus Stanford, Duarte tallied 11 of team-high 23 points in the final 5:43 to turn a four-point cushion into a 17-point win.

EUGENE NAMED PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior forward **Eugene Omoruyi** was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week (Nov. 30-Dec. 6) after averaging 26.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game in a pair of games in Omaha, Neb. The Rexdale, Ontario, native scored a career-high 31 points with 11 rebounds in the season-opener Dec. 2 against Missouri. Not only was his 31 points the most ever by a player in his first game as a Duck, he joined Kansas State's Michael Beasley (2007-08) and North Carolina's Cole Anthony (2019-20) as the only major conference players in the last 25 years to have 30-plus points and 10-plus rebounds in their team debut (@StatsBySTATS). It was the eighth career double-double for the transfer from Rutgers. Omoruyi followed the Missouri game with 22 points in the Ducks' Dec. 4 win against Seton Hall. For the week, Omoruyi shot 55.6 percent from the field (20-of-36).

RARE TRIFECTA

Oregon became the first school in conference history to win championships in football, men's basketball and women's basketball in the same academic year when the Ducks claimed the 2019 football title and the 2019-20 men's and women's basketball crowns. Oregon joined Ohio State (2005-06, 2006-07, 2009-10) as just the second Power Five school to ever achieve that accomplishment.

HISTORIC DEFENSIVE EFFORT VS. PORTLAND

Oregon's defensive effort Dec. 19 against Portland was among the best in the nation this season. The Ducks held the Pilots to 21.4 percent shooting from the field (12-of-56). In games between two Division I opponents, only two schools have done better this season. Florida held Stetson to 19.6 percent shooting (10-of-51) on Dec. 6 and North Texas limited UTEP to 21.2 percent (11-of-52) on Jan. 15. The Pilots' 21.4 percent was also a low for an Oregon opponent at Matthew Knight Arena. The previous low was 23.4 percent by Eastern Washington on Nov. 9, 2018.

DOUBLE TAKE

Two Ducks recorded double-doubles Dec. 7 against Eastern Washington - **Eric Williams Jr.** (17 pts, 10 reb) and **LJ Figueroa** (12 pts, 10 reb). It was the first time that two Ducks had double-doubles in the same game since a pair of future NBA players - **Troy Brown Jr.** (16 pts, 10 reb) and **Payton Pritchard** (19 pts, 10 asst) - had double-doubles against Washington State on Feb. 11, 2018. It was the first double-double as a Duck for both players. It was the 18th career double-double for Williams Jr., and the ninth career for Figueroa.

PRESEASON HONORS FOR DUARTE, RICHARDSON

Will Richardson, who led the Pac-12 in three-point field goal percentage a year ago (.469), and **Chris Duarte** were named to the preseason all-Pac-12 first team. Duarte was an honorable mention selection for both the all-conference team and the all-defensive team a year ago.

STUBBLEFIELD PROMOTED TO ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

Men's basketball assistant **Tony Stubblefield** was promoted to associate head coach prior to the Dec. 2 season opener against Missouri. "This is a well-earned promotion for all the outstanding work that Tony has done for our program," said coach **Dana Altman**. "His work ethic, knowledge of the game and loyalty to the University of Oregon and our team have really contributed to the successes we've been able to achieve over the last decade." Stubblefield, in his 11th season at Oregon, is an original member of Altman's coaching staff. During his tenure, Stubblefield helped Oregon assemble five recruiting classes that were ranked among the top 12 nationally (2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2021). Included in those classes were future NBA players **Troy Brown Jr.**, **Bol Bol** and **Louis King** and 2020 NBA first round draft choice **Payton Pritchard**. Stubblefield also mentored 2015 Pac-12 player of the year **Joe Young**.

CONSISTENT COACHING STAFF

Success on the court often goes hand-in-hand with continuity off the court. During the 11-year **Dana Altman** era, Oregon has seen just one change on its coaching staff. That came following the 2013-14 season, when assistant coach **Brian Fish** accepted the head coaching job at Montana State, and was replaced by current assistant **Michael Mennenga**. Oregon's two other assistants, **Kevin McKenna** and **Tony Stubblefield**, have been with Altman at Oregon since day one. The Ducks' continuity extends even beyond the assistant coaches with director of operations **Josh Jamieson** in his 17th year and athletic trainer **Clay Jamieson** in his 23rd season in Eugene.

NOTES

DANTE SETS MKA RECORD; DOUBLES UP AT UW

N'Faly Dante set the Matthew Knight Arena field goal percentage record by making all 10 of his field goal attempts Dec. 9 versus Florida A&M. That's one field goal better than the nine-of-nine effort by Texas Southern's Trayvon Reed in the Tigers' 2018 upset of the Ducks. Dante's 10-of-10 night was just one make shy of the all-time UO record (11-of-11) by **Bryce Taylor** against USC in the 2007 Pac-10 Tournament championship game. Dante scored a career-high 22 points against the Rattlers. The Bamako, Mali, native followed that game with his first career double-double Dec. 12 at Washington with 12 points and a career-high 10 rebounds. Dante suffered a season-ending knee injury Dec. 17 versus San Francisco.

NBA DRAFT NOTES

In the 2020 NBA Draft, **Payton Pritchard** became the sixth Duck drafted in the last four years. Pritchard, the 2020 Bob Cousy National Point Guard of the Year, was chosen by the Boston Celtics with the 26th overall pick. It is the fourth consecutive year that Oregon has had at least one player drafted and is the second time in the last three drafts that the Ducks have produced a first rounder. Pritchard will become just the third Duck to play for the Celtics, joining **Jim Loscutoff**, who was a member of six World Championship teams with Boston from 1956-64, and **Jim Barnett** (1967). Both men are in the UO Athletic Hall of Fame. The Ducks are now one of just eight programs nationally that has produced six or more NBA Draft picks over the last four seasons. Oregon is joined in that elite echelon of college programs by Duke (14), Kentucky (13), Florida State (7), Villanova (7), Arizona (6), North Carolina (6) and UCLA (6).

NBA ROSTER NOTES AND THAT 2017 FINAL FOUR TEAM

Oregon has six alums who have played in the NBA during the 2020-21 season. **Chris Boucher** won a World Championship with Toronto in 2018-19 and is in his third year with the Raptors (fourth in the NBA overall). Now a starter, **Dillon Brooks** is in his fourth season with Memphis. **Troy Brown Jr.** is entering his third year in Washington. **Bol Bol** debuted with Denver in the 2020 NBA bubble and returns for his second season with the Nuggets. **Payton Pritchard** joined the NBA ranks after being drafted by Boston in the first round of the 2020 NBA Draft. He is the fifth member of the Ducks' 2017 Final Four Team to play in the NBA, joining Boucher, Brooks, **Jordan Bell** and **Tyler Dorsey**. Bell played on a 10-day contract with Washington this year.

G LEAGUE DUCKS

In addition to the NBA, five Ducks are in the professional ranks in the NBA G League. Oregon alumni rostered for 2020-21 include **Jordan Bell** (Erie), **Louis King** (Westchester), **Anthony Mathis** (Austin), **Paul White** (Salt Lake City) and **Kenny Wooten** (Rio Grande Valley).

BROOKS JOINS KNICKS' COACHING STAFF

The New York Knicks added Oregon Hall of Famer **Aaron Brooks** to their coaching staff. Brooks, a 10-year NBA veteran, will be a two-way liaison, assisting the Knicks at both the NBA and the G-League levels. The Seattle, Wash., native can be found throughout the Oregon record book. He is 14th in scoring (1,511 points), fifth in assists (471), ninth in steals (127) and sixth in three-pointers (205). He led the Pac-10 in scoring as a senior in 2006-07 at 17.7 points per game when he led Oregon to the NCAA Midwest Regional final where the Ducks fell to eventual national champion Florida, 85-77. It was the Gators' closest game of the 2007 NCAA Tournament. Brooks is best remembered for his game-winning shot against UCLA when the Ducks took down the top-ranked Bruins 68-66 in McArthur Court on Jan. 6, 2007. After being named all-Pac-10 first team and a first team All-American by the Wooden Award, Brooks was selected as the 26th overall pick by the Houston Rockets in the 2007 NBA Draft. He was named the NBA's Most Improved Player in 2009-10 after averaging a career best 19.6 points, 5.3 assists and 2.6 rebounds over 35.6 minutes in 82 games for the Rockets. Brooks played 10 seasons in the NBA, averaging 9.7 points and 3.0 assists in 645 career games (183 starts) for Houston, Phoenix, Sacramento, Denver, Chicago, Indiana and

Minnesota. He joins the Knicks after last playing in Australia with the Illawarra Hawks in 2019. The four-year letterman was inducted into the Oregon Athletic Hall of Fame in 2017.

OREGON INKS HIGHLY RANKED RECRUITING CLASS

Oregon signed three players rated among the top 50 high schoolers nationally for the class of 2021. ESPN rates **Nathan Bittle** (6-11, 200, Central Point, Ore. (Crater HS/Prolific Prep)) as the eighth-best prospect in the nation, with **Franck Kepnang** (6-11, 225, Yaoundé, Cameroon (Westtown (Pa.) HS)) at No. 22 and **Johnathan Lawson** (6-6, 165, Memphis, Tenn. (Wooddale HS)) at No. 47. That class was ranked No. 1 in the nation by ESPN and No. 8 by Sports Illustrated. Bittle, the 2020 Oregon 5A player of the year for Crater High School, is the sixth five-star signee (247Sports) for the Ducks since 2017. He is the highest-rated in-state recruit landed by Oregon, surpassing 2020 Bob Cousy National Point Guard of the Year **Payton Pritchard** of West Linn. Bittle was named to the 2021 Naismith Trophy high school boys watch list. Kepnang, from Yaoundé, Cameroon, prepped at Westtown High School in West Chester, Pa. He was ranked among the top eight centers nationally by ESPN, Rivals and 247Sports and was in the top 50 players overall by those three services. Kepnang reclassified and joined the 2020-21 team at the end of the fall term. Lawson, the 2020 Tennessee Gatorade Player of the Year and Class AA Mr. Basketball, is the younger brother of current Duck sophomore **Chandler Lawson** and will become the fourth member of the Lawson family to play Division I basketball. Oregon will also welcome **Isaac Johnson** (6-11, 220, American Fork, Utah (American Fork HS)) as a member of the 2021-22 freshman class. Johnson, a four-star center, signed with the Ducks in 2018 before embarking on a two-year LDS mission.

ALTMAN PAC-12 TOURNAMENT'S WINNINGEST COACH

With 20 wins, **Dana Altman** is the winningest coach in Pac-12 Tournament history. He passed Sean Miller, Arizona (who now has 18), and Lute Olson, Arizona (16) during the 2019 tournament. It was also during the 2019 event that Oregon became the first school to win the conference tournament by defeating the top three seeds.

DUCKS IN THE DESERT

No one has won more Pac-12 Tournament games in Las Vegas than Oregon. The Ducks are 18-5 since the league moved the championship to the desert in 2013. In their eight tournaments in Las Vegas, the Ducks have played in five championship games (winning in 2013, 2016 and 2019) and have advanced to the semifinal round seven times. The only year the Ducks departed Vegas prior to the semis was in 2014 after a quarterfinal loss to UCLA.

PAC-12 TOURNAMENT STAYING POWER

Since the conference tournament returned in 2002, Oregon has won at least one game in 15 of 18 appearances and went on to take the conference crown five times (2003, 2007, 2013, 2016, 2019). The Ducks are 31-13 (.705) in 18 appearances since 2002. Oregon's only first round exits during that span came in 2008, 2009 and 2012. Including the conference tournaments from 1987-90, Oregon's overall .660 winning percentage (33-17) is third-best in the conference, while the Ducks' five titles trail only Arizona's seven.

FORMER S-A PHIL KNIGHT PLEDGES \$500 MILLION FOR SCIENCE

UO graduate and former track and field student-athlete Phil Knight, the co-founder of Nike, and his wife Penny made a half-a-billion dollar commitment to scientific research at the University of Oregon. It is the largest gift ever bestowed to a public university. "This act of philanthropy from Penny and Phil Knight is breathtaking," said University of Oregon President Michael Schill. "This is a seminal moment for the University of Oregon, an inflection point that will shape the trajectory of the university and this state for the next century and beyond." The Knight's \$500 million donation funded the ongoing construction of a new science complex that opened in December of 2020.

Dana Altman is one of only five active coaches in NCAA Division I with 24 consecutive winning seasons. He is part of an exclusive fraternity that includes Hall-of-Famers Mike Krzyzewski, Tom Izzo, Bill Self and Jim Boeheim.

He is the 34th head coach to record 600 career wins at the Division I level and is the winningest head coach in Oregon history. In 2016-17, Altman led Oregon back to the Final Four for the first time in 78 years.

In 2019, he became the winningest coach in Pac-12 Tournament history and now has 20 victories.

The 2013 National Coach of the Year and three-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year, Altman is 279-109 in Eugene, and 689-352 in 32 seasons as a head coach at the NCAA Division I level in stints at Oregon, Creighton, Kansas State and Marshall.

Altman, the 19th head coach in the history of the University of Oregon men's basketball program, has led the Ducks to 11 consecutive 20-win seasons and 10 postseason appearances. He led Oregon to five straight NCAA Tournaments (2013-17) for the first time in school history, winning at least one game in each of those years. Included in those NCAA appearances are a Final Four (2017), two Elite Eights (2016, 2017) and three Sweet 16s (2013, 2016, 2017). The Ducks made their fourth Sweet 16 appearance under Altman in 2019 and were named the Pac-12's automatic qualifier for the 2020 NCAA Tournament before the worldwide Coronavirus epidemic cancelled the postseason. Altman now has 23 seasons of 20-plus wins to his credit (11 at Creighton, 11 at Oregon, one at Kansas State).

In 2019-20, Altman helped Payton Pritchard earn the Bob Cousy National Point Guard of the Year award for the first time in program history. The Pac-12 player of the year and NBA first round draft pick (Boston, No. 26) was Oregon's first consensus first team All-American in 80 years as the Ducks won the Pac-12 regular season title for the third time in the last five years despite a roster that was constantly changing due to injury. The Ducks' win at No. 5 Michigan was the highest-ranked nonconference win in program history as Oregon went 6-2 against ranked foes in 2019-20.

Oregon's 2018-19 season will be remembered for the Ducks' winning four games in four days to claim the Pac-12 Tournament title. Oregon rode that momentum to a Sweet 16 appearance, losing to eventual national champion Virginia. In addition to another 20-win season and a postseason appearance, the 2017-18 season saw another first for Altman when Troy Brown Jr. became his first career NBA first round draft choice (No. 15 overall, Washington).

Oregon entered the 2016-17 season with lofty expectations, and the Ducks lived up to every one of them. The Ducks won the Pac-12 title for the second consecutive season and advanced to the Final Four for the first time since the 1939 Webfoots won the very first NCAA title. Along the way, Oregon won a program-record 33 games and also reached a high-water mark for conference victories with 16. Dillon Brooks was named the Pac-12 player of the year and a consensus all-American, while Jordan Bell was the Pac-12 defensive player of the year and the NCAA Midwest Regional most outstanding player. Jordan, Brooks and Tyler Dorsey were all selected in the 2017 NBA Draft.

The 2015-16 season saw Altman reach new heights as a coach and achieve honors matched only by some of the very best mentors in the history of the Pac-12 Conference. Altman guided Oregon to the Pac-12's regular season and conference title in the same year for the first time in school history. He also reached the NCAA's Elite Eight for the first time and was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the third time in four seasons, a feat matched only by Hall of Famer Lute Olson of Arizona. The individual honors won by players under his guidance included all-American Brooks, Pac-12 Tournament MOP Elgin Cook, Pac-12 all-defensive selection Chris Boucher and Pac-12 all-freshman pick Dorsey.

In 2014-15, in one of the finest coaching performances of his career, Altman guided a team that had only three returning scholarship players to a 26-10 record, a runner-up finish in the Pac-12 (13-5) and the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He was the runaway choice for Pac-12 Coach of the Year, while Joseph Young tied the school single-season scoring record in being named Pac-12 Player of the Year. Cook was an all-Pac-12 second-team selection, while Bell and Brooks made the Pac-12's all-freshman team.

The 2013-14 season saw Altman win his 500th game as a Division I head coach when Oregon defeated Washington on Feb. 19. He also joined Basketball Hall of Famer Howard Hobson as the only men to lead Oregon to four consecutive 20-win seasons. He guided Oregon to a 24-10 overall record and an NCAA Tournament win. Young was an all-conference second team selection and an all-Pac-12 tournament pick, while Mike Moser was an honorable mention selection by the conference.

Altman's 2012-13 Oregon Ducks became the first UO team since 2008 to qualify for the NCAA Tournament. The Ducks finished the season 28-9 and won the Pac-12 Tournament. Altman was named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year before going on to earn Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year honors. Senior E.J. Singler was an all-league first team selection, while Johnathan Loyd was named Most Outstanding Player of the Pac-12 Tournament as the honors were spread around nearly the entire team. Senior Arsalan Kazemi was a Pac-12 all-defensive pick before going on to become a second round draft choice of the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers.

During the 2011-12 season, Altman led the Ducks to a 24-10 overall record and a 13-5 Pac-12 Conference mark which was good for

a share of second place in the final league standings. The Ducks earned a bid to the National Invitation Tournament and recorded victories over LSU and Iowa before falling at top-seed Washington in the tournament quarterfinals. Under Altman's tutelage, Devoe Joseph became the first Duck since the 2006-07 season to be named first team all-conference, while Singler was named to the all-conference second team.

In his first season at Oregon, Altman led the Ducks to just the 12th season of 20+ victories in the history of the program. He became just the third UO head coach to tally 20+ wins in his first season on the job. Oregon went 21-18 overall and 7-11 in Pac-12 play. Altman posted the second-highest win total of any first-year UO head coach.

Only John Warren (30 wins in 1944-45) posted more in his first year on the sidelines. Oregon participated in the 2011 College Basketball Invitational, defeating Altman's former team – Creighton – in the best-of-three championship series.

Altman arrived at UO after spending 16 seasons at Creighton where he became the school's all-time winningest coach with a record of 327-176 (.650). He led the Blue Jays to 13 consecutive postseason appearances, a stretch of 11 straight seasons with 20-plus wins, all while producing 10 or more league victories in each of the last 14 seasons. Those three feats were unmatched in the 103 years of the Missouri Valley Conference.

He won four Coach-of-the-Year awards from three different conferences in a span of 13 seasons, including back-to-back MVC coaching honors while he was at the Omaha, Neb., school in 2001 and 2002. Altman was a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award and was named the NABC District 12 and USBWA District VI Coach of the Year following the 2002-03 campaign.

Creighton participated in seven NCAA Men's Basketball Tournaments and five National Invitation Tournaments under Altman, advancing to the second round of the NCAA championships in both the 1998-99 and 2001-02 seasons. He led the school to a MVC regular-season title in 2000-01 – its first in 10 years. The Bluejays posted a school-record 29 wins in 2002-03, finishing the season 15th in the Associated Press poll and 23rd in the coaches' voting.

Altman finished his career at Creighton ranking third all-time on the MVC list of all-time wins (327), trailing only Basketball Hall of Fame coaches Henry Iba (486) and Eddie Hickey (337). In 2007, he was one of 10 coaches named as part of the MVC's All-Centennial Team. His teams claimed shares of three regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championships (including the 2008-09 crown) and six conference post-season tournament titles. Creighton inducted Altman into its athletics hall of fame in 2018.

Student-athletes under his direction at CU earned six All-America honors on the court and four Academic All-America laurels in the classroom. Three players he coached at Creighton – Kyle Korver, Rodney Buford and Anthony Tolliver – have played in the NBA.

Altman compiled a 68-54 record in four seasons (1990-94) at Kansas State. During that time, Altman led the Wildcats to three straight postseason tournaments and was named the Big Eight Conference Coach of the Year after leading KSU to a 19-11 record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

Altman's final Kansas State club turned heads nationally with a 68-64 win at No. 1 Kansas on Jan. 17, 1994. K-State eventually advanced to play in the NIT Final Four. Altman's success at KSU followed him from a brief head coaching stint at Marshall where he was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 1990.

While head coach at Southeast Junior College in Fairbury, Neb., his first team (1982-83) rolled to a 29-6 record and a third-place finish in the junior college national tournament and Altman was honored as both Region 9 and the Nebraska College Coach of the Year.

In 1983, Altman accepted the head coaching position at Moberly (Mo.) Junior College, with a three-year run resulting in a staggering 94-18 record (25-9 in 1983-84; 35-5 with a third-place finish at the national tourney in 1984-85; and a 34-4 mark in 1985-86 with a sixth-place finish at nationals).

He was named Region 16 Coach of the Year in both the 1984-85 and 1985-86 seasons, and was also a finalist for 1986 National Junior College Athletic Association Coach of the Year accolades.

Altman's playing career began at Southeast Junior College in 1976, where he captained teams to a 22-10 mark in his freshman year and a 26-5 record in his sophomore season.

Altman completed his undergraduate education and playing career at Eastern New Mexico University. After earning his associate degree in business administration from Southeast in 1978, Altman graduated magna cum laude from Eastern New Mexico in 1980 with his bachelor's degree in the same field.

Altman received his master of business administration degree from Western (Colo.) State in 1981. He served as an assistant coach on the Western State staff from 1980-82.

At Wilber (Neb.) High School, Altman was a two-sport letterman, earning all-conference honors as a quarterback on the football team and as a guard in basketball. Altman was born June 16, 1958, in Crete, Neb. He and his wife, the former Reva Phillips of Stanton, Neb., have three sons, Jordan, Chase and Spencer, and one daughter, Audra.

FIRST NCAA CHAMPIONS -- THE TALL FIRS

Oregon's 1939 basketball team earned a niche in sports history by winning the first NCAA championship basketball tournament ever held.

With a first unit composed of four native Oregonians and one Washingtonian, Coach Howard Hobson guided the Tall Firs to a 29-5 season record and Oregon's only NCAA basketball title.

The starting five listed three All-Americans in 6-foot 8-inch Urgel 'Slim' Wintermute from Longview, Wash., sharp-shooting Laddie Gale, a 6-4 forward from Oakridge and 5-8 guard Bobby Anet from Astoria. In addition, John Dick, a 6-4 forward from The Dalles, earned All-America honors the following season.

The guard spots were manned by Astorians Anet and 5-11 Wally Johansen. The two had teamed since their grade school days in Astoria.

For reserve strength, Hobson called on the likes of Bob Hardy, Red McNeely, Ford Mullen, Matt Pavalunas, Earl Sandness and Ted Sarpola. Gale, Wintermute, Anet, Johansen and Mullen played on three consecutive Northern Division championship teams.

The Ducks posted a 10-3 non-conference record, highlighted by a two-week Christmas tour that opened in Madison Square Garden with a 38-36 loss to CCNY and concluded with a 50-46 defeat at the hands of Stanford.

In between, however, the Tall Firs won six of seven games giving them a highly respectable 6-3 road mark against some of the nation's finest teams.

Oregon powered to the Northern Division title with a 14-2 record, sweeping four-game series from Idaho and Washington and capturing three of four battles each with Oregon State and Washington State.

That set the stage for a best-of-three playoff with Southern Division champion California at McArthur Court. Before capacity crowds, the Ducks captured the Pacific Coast Conference title in two games. Gale scored 18 points and Wintermute added 11 as the Ducks won the opener, 54-40, and Wintermute and Dick each tallied 16 points in the 53-47 triumph that put Oregon in the NCAA Western Playoffs.

Oregon quickly went to work in the Western Playoffs at Treasure Island, knocking off Texas, 56-41, and dumping Oklahoma, 55-37.

On March 27, the Tall Firs faced Ohio State on the neutral Northwestern University court at Evanston, Ill., for the national title. Dick scored 13 points and Gale and Anet contributed 10 apiece as the Ducks rolled to a 46-33 victory and the NCAA crown.

Huge crowds welcomed them in Portland and Eugene to climax one of the legendary events in the state's athletic history.
