<i>Alex Bradley – Pine Forest</i>	Bradley earned MVP honors of the Holiday Classic after scoring 14 points to lead Pine Forest to 54-42 win over Seventy-First in the championship game.
<i>Austin Fleming – West Stokes</i>	Fleming was named MVP of the Frank Spencer Holiday Classic after scoring 18 points as West Stokes knocked off Winston-Salem Prep in triple-overtime, 83-71.
<i>Justin Gordon – Northside Christian</i>	Gordon scored 15 points and pulled down eight rebounds in Northside Christian's 77-48 win over Mooresville the championship game of the Hardwood Classic. Gordon was named tournament MVP.
